

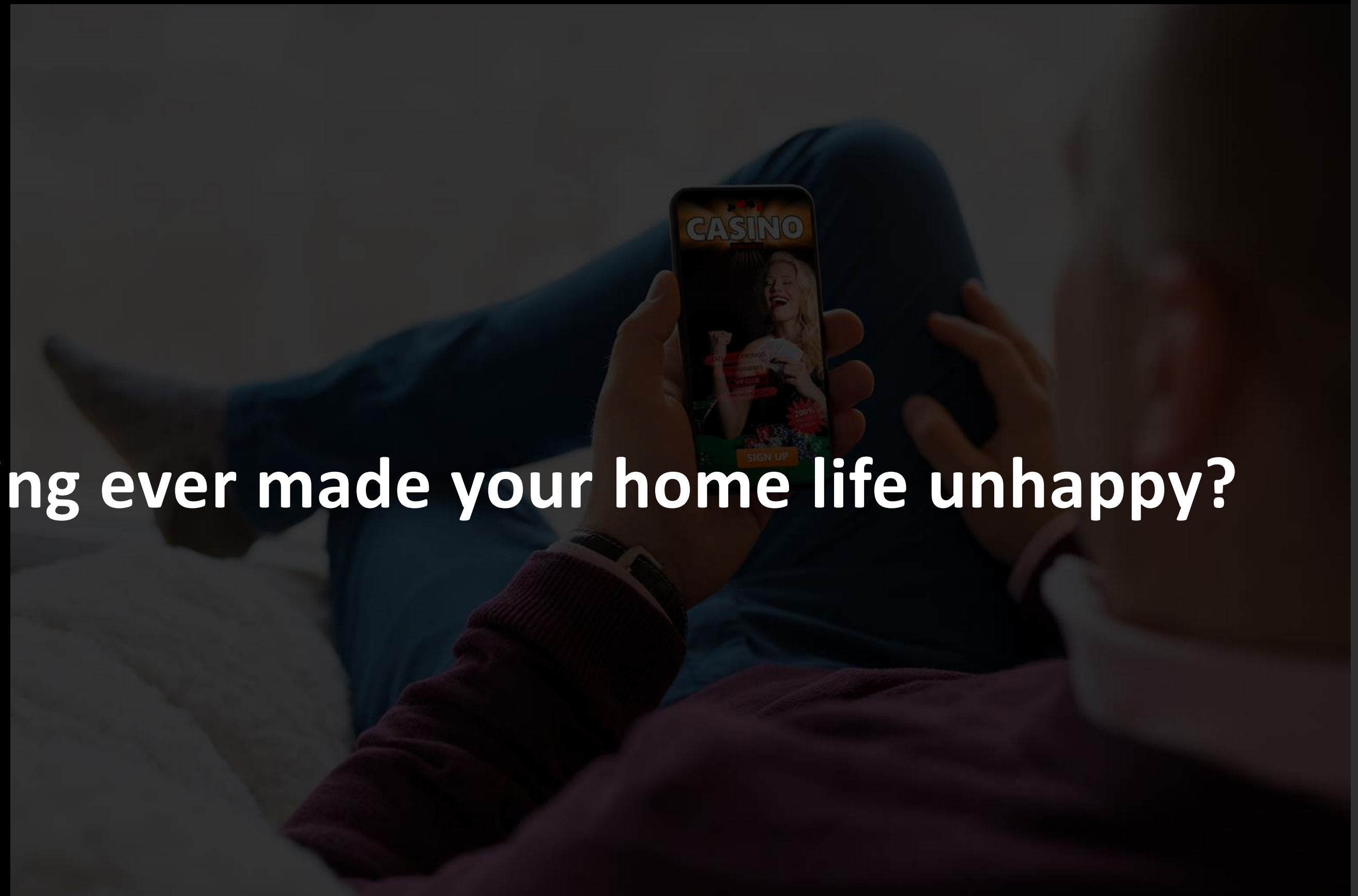



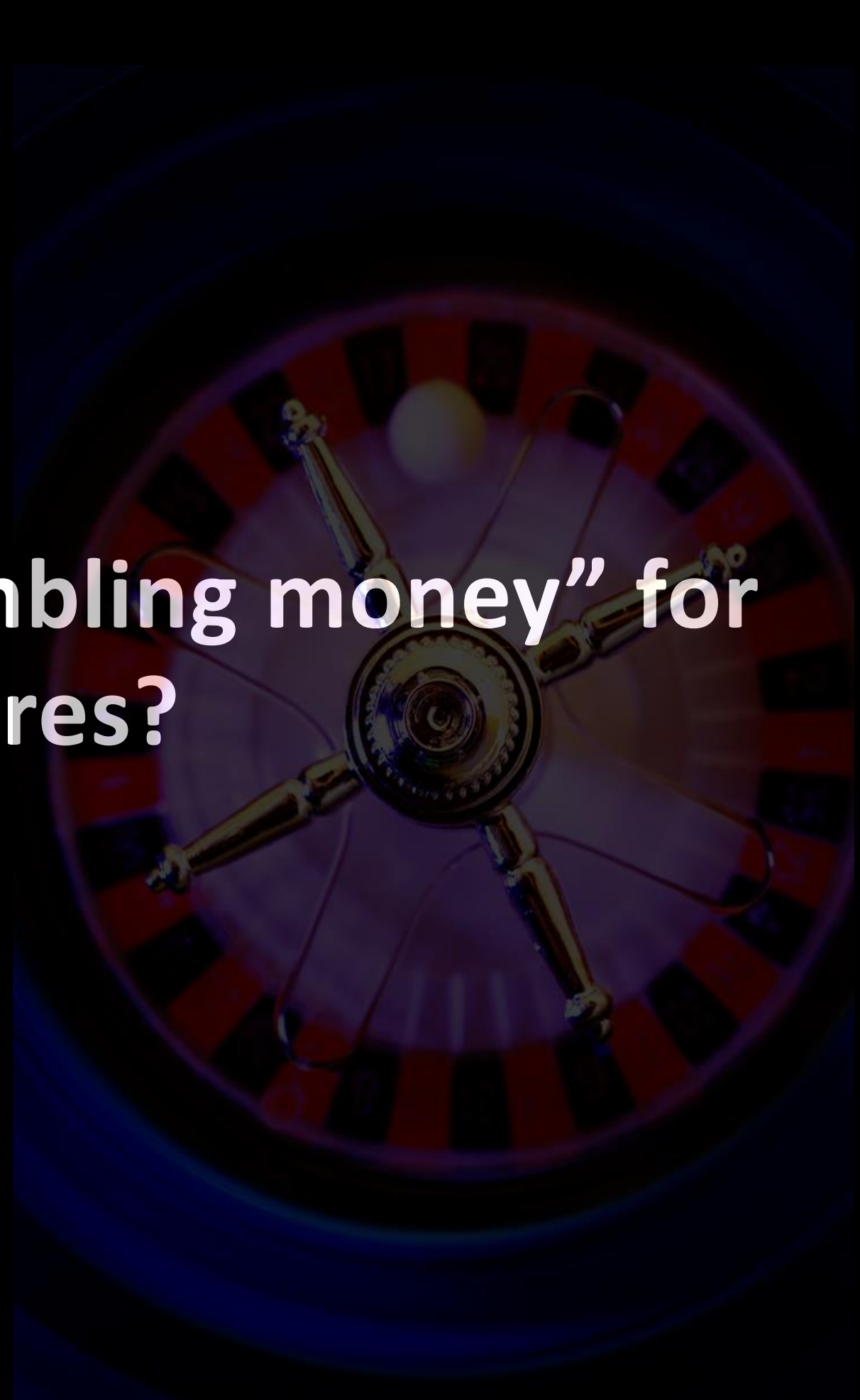

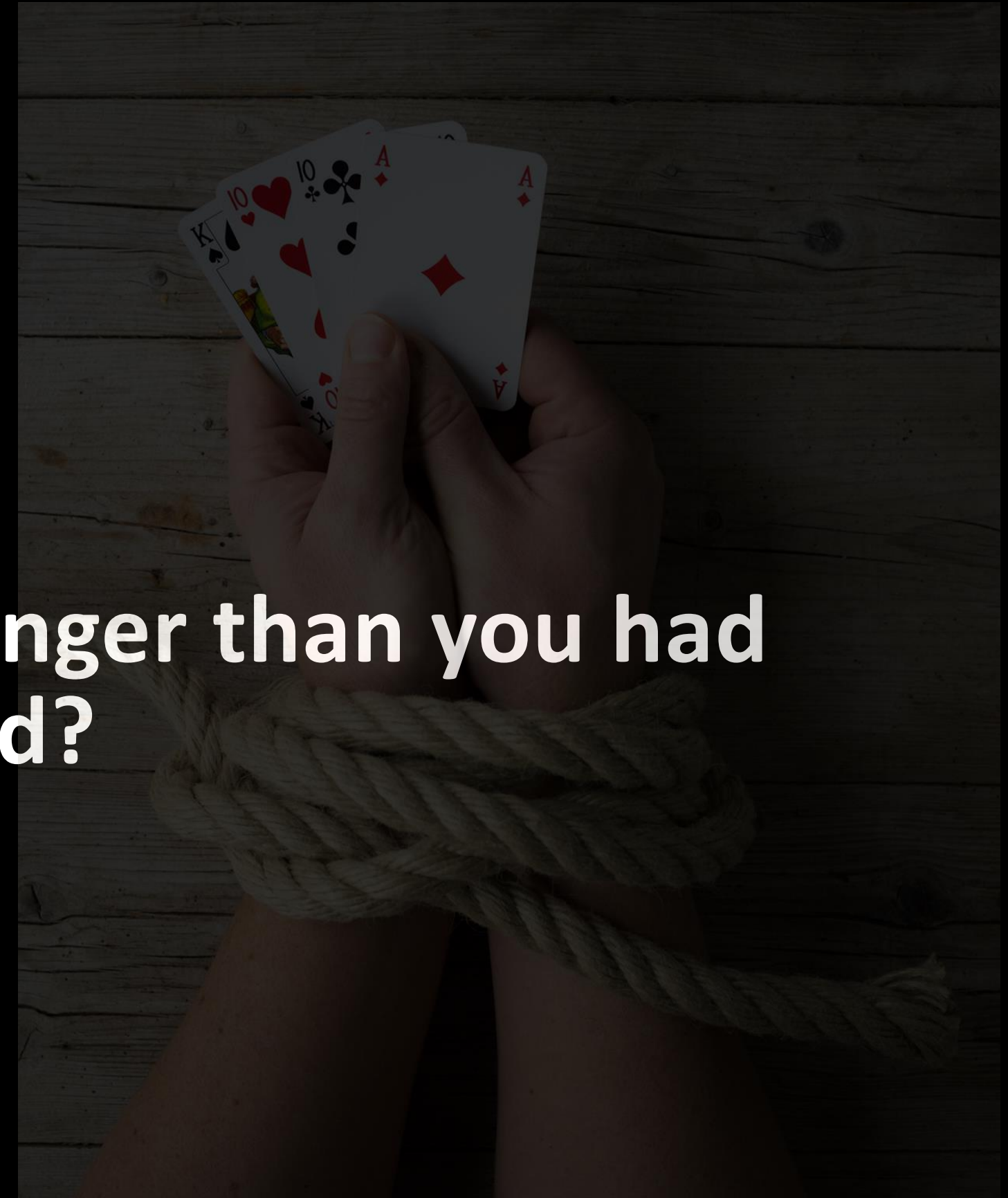



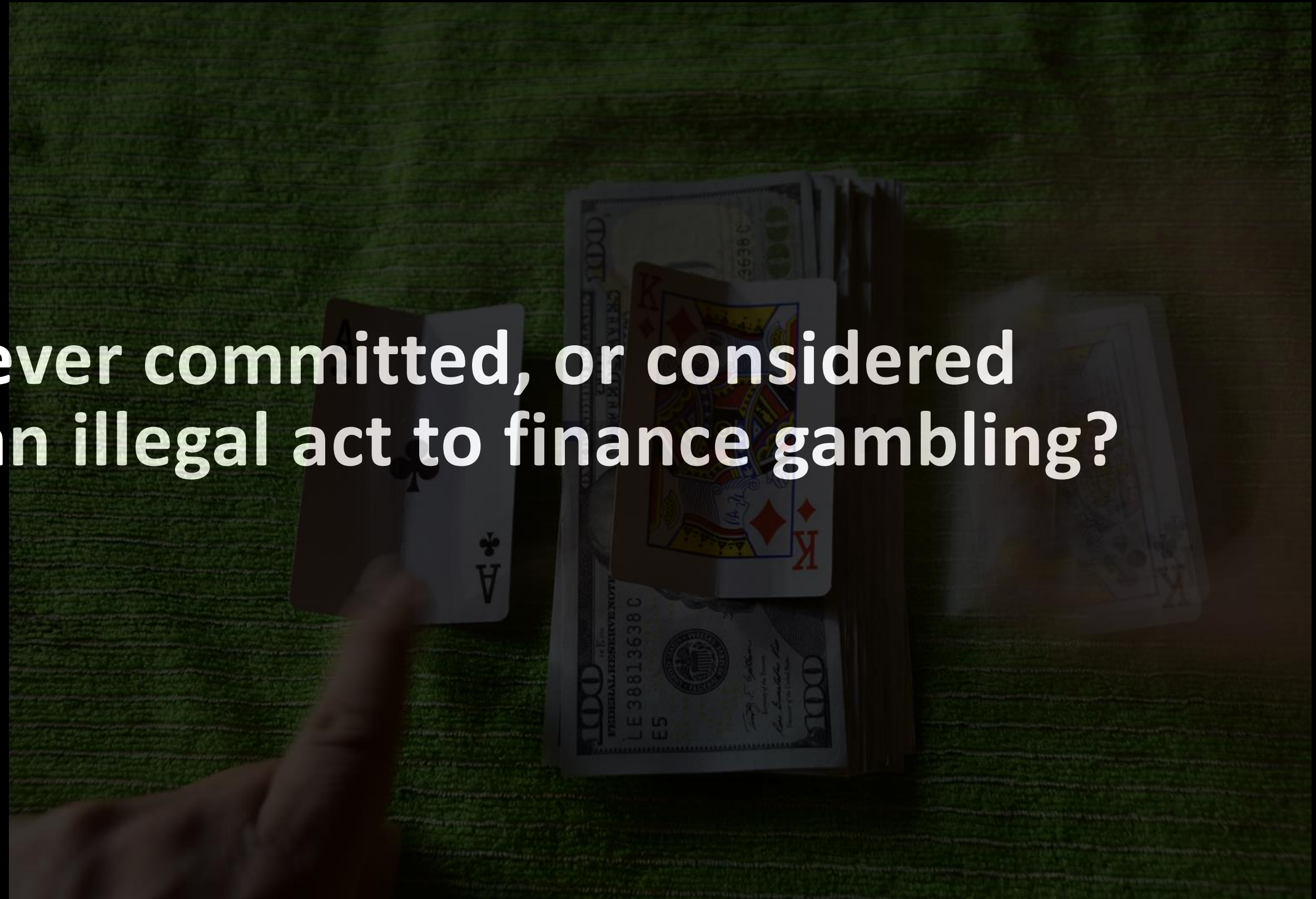
Did you ever gamble longer than you had planned?

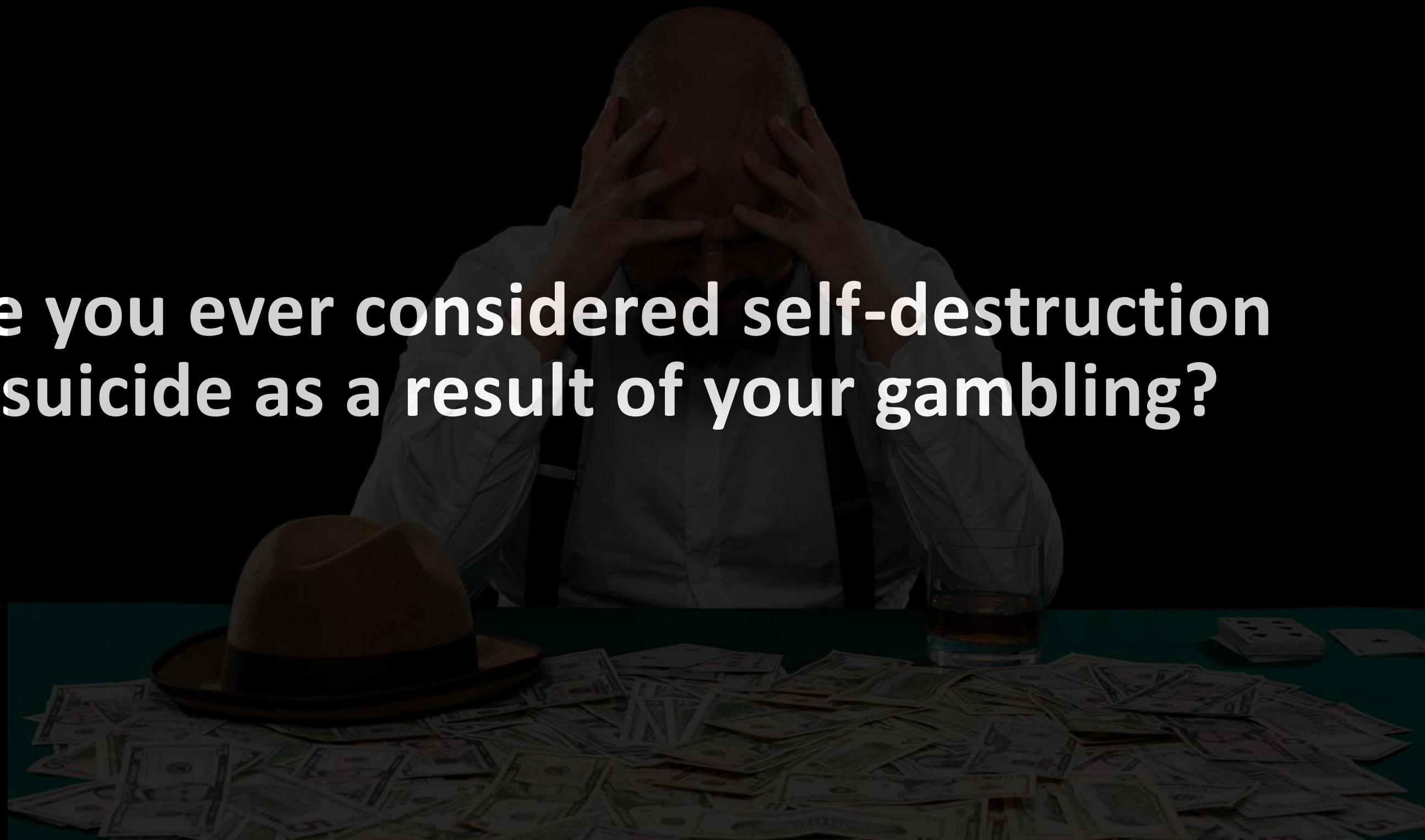



**Do arguments, disappointment or frustrations create
